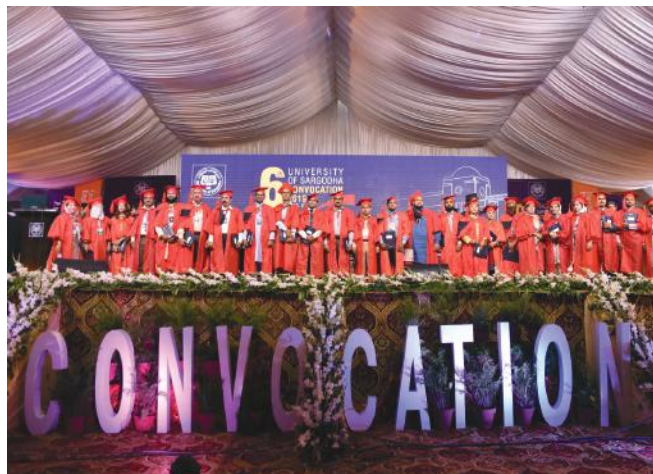

DR FAZAL PARTICIPATES IN CONFERENCE ON DIALOGUE OF ASIAN CIVILIZATION AS DISTINGUISHED GUEST

Dr Fazal ur Rahman, Director Pakistan Institute of China Studies (PICS), Sargodha University, participated in the Conference on Dialogue of Asian Civilization as one of the distinguished Pakistani participants. The Conference held in Beijing on May 15 under the theme 'Exchanges and Mutual Learning among Asian Civilizations and a Community with a Shared Future for Asia.'

In this mega event, a total of 1352 representatives from all 47 countries in Asia, countries in other parts of the world and international organizations participated.

The Conference aimed at creating a platform to provide opportunities for dialogue among the Asian civilizations and forging better understanding and cooperation among them.

Chinese President Xi Jinping made the keynote speech at the inaugural session of the Conference which highlighted the role of civilizations in emerging global trends. He stated, 'the world today is moving towards greater multi-polarity, economic globalization and cultural diversity, and is becoming increasingly information-oriented.'

He pointed out that instability and uncertainties are mounting and the global challenges faced by humanity are becoming ever more daunting, calling for joint responses from countries around the world.

President Xi summed up the hopes of the Asian people in three sentences: we Asian people hope to see peace and stability across Asia; we Asian people hope to see common development; and we Asian people hope to see an open and better-connected Asia.

Dr Fazal ur Rahman, expressed his views on importance of interactions among civilizations for achieving the objective of creating a community of shared future.

He highlighted the fact that Asia covers one third of the globe's land mass; two thirds of the world's population and has more than thousand ethnic communities living in 47 states. The Asian civilizations in the past have greatly benefited from sharing knowledge and experiences of each other. No civilization is superior to the others. Each civilization has its own peculiar strengths and if put together would be beneficial for the mankind.

Director PICS also signed an MoU with the Jingtangshan University on May 18 on behalf of Sargodha University.

PROVISIONS OF THE MOU:

- Scientific research cooperation in areas including agriculture, medicines, etc.
- Joint establishment of a Confucius Institute at Sargodha University.
- Development of faculty and student exchange program.
- Development of other cooperation programs in specific areas of mutual interest.

Jingtangshan University is a state-owned comprehensive university, jointly run by Chinese Ministry of Education and Jiangxi Provincial Government and assisted by Tongji University, Shanghai. The university has 21 schools, more than 19,000 students that include 500 overseas students. There are 150 Pakistani students studying medicine and engineering in Jingtangshan University. Director PICS had a long motivational session with the Pakistani students of medicine and encouraged them to work hard and set a high standard of learning.

Q&A SESSION

Q&A WITH ACTING CHINESE AMBASSADOR MR ZHAO LIJIAN

Mr Zhao Lijian is the Deputy Chief of Mission at the Chinese Embassy, Islamabad. He has been more than a diplomat who goes beyond the realms of traditional diplomacy to promote people-to-people relations between China and Pakistan. As a focal person of the Embassy on CPEC, he has been consistently responding to queries on social media to dispel the misconceptions regarding the CPEC. With a trending Twitter hashtag #AskLijianZhao, he has answered thousands of queries. He is one of the most popular diplomats in Islamabad who is seen everywhere and easily accessible to all. He strongly believes that the CPEC will benefit Pakistan's development and help in strengthening people-to-people relations between Pakistan and China.

The Sargodha Literary Festival was honored with the presence of Mr Zhao Lijian, the Acting Ambassador of China to Pakistan. The guest highlighted the depth of Pak-China friendship by saying that Pakistan and China are not fair-weather friends, but all-weather friends and this friendship is interminable. Mr Zhao Lijian answered some important questions.

What are your views regarding third-party participation in CPEC?

There is a lot of third-party participation in the CPEC; for instance, the joint venture between China and Qatar, where China is having 51% share and Qatar 49%. The International Finance Corporation is also providing 50% finance for the Karot Hydropower Project alongside the US companies which are also part of this project. We are open to all the European, US and Japanese companies. The industrial corporation under CPEC works on two principles:

- There should be a consensus of China on the agreement.
- There should be a benefit for both parties.

CPEC is facing certain internal and external challenges, how these challenges can be encountered?

The Pakistani government is good at averting the internal threats to this project and external challenges can be very well tackled by China. It is true that some countries are not happy with CPEC but we should be determined and do our own homework in a better way.

How China can help in training Pakistani workers through vocational institutes?

It is difficult to find skilled workers in Pakistan and the system is not fully developed here. We have developed a website to facilitate the workers but the institutes of training are not established yet. This gap will soon be filled as the Chinese Embassy is planning to set up training centers in various cities of Pakistan.

How China made it possible to eradicate corruption from the country? What do you suggest for Pakistan in this regard?

In the past 5 years, China removed four hundred minister-level officials and 1.5 million under joint secretary level officials because of corruption charges. There is no compromise over the honesty. The money of the state is not for the dishonest officials, and we put them behind bars if they commit corruption. Pakistan can follow the same strategy to eradicate the curse of corruption.

How can we overcome the cultural gap between China and Pakistan?

We should train our staff to understand the culture, customs and religion of each other. If the mutual sense of respect is present between the two countries, the cultural gaps would not be problematic at all.

PERVEZ HOODBHOY ON 'LOVING PAKISTAN: WHAT IT REALLY MEANS'

Pervez Hoodbhoy is a Nuclear Physicist who serves as Distinguished Professor of Physics and Mathematics at Forman Christian College, Lahore. Previously, he has been teaching at Quaid-e-Azam University, Islamabad and Lahore University of Management Sciences. Hoodbhoy is also a prominent activist for the promotion of freedom of speech and education in Pakistan.

Renowned nuclear physicist, columnist and social activist, Pervez Hoodbhoy delivered a concluding lecture on 'Loving Pakistan: What it Really Means' to a large number of students and faculty members on the last day of Sargodha Literary Festival, April 25.

KEY POINTS

- Loving Pakistan demands love, compassion, and respect for every Pakistani irrespective of occupation, language, ethnicity, culture, and religion. Moreover, being a patriot does not mean to be willing to sacrifice life for the motherland but to pay taxes, contribute to the prosperity of the country, and abide by the laws and constitution of the state.
- The idea of freedom of thinking and rationality should be nurtured through educational institutions as real institutions ignite imagination beyond limits, critical thinking process, and reasoning abilities. Only then, we will be able to reach the pinnacle of creativity and innovation.
- Nationalism, around 400 years back, propelled humans to build territories with geographical boundaries and work as one administrative unit in their territory and compete with other nations. Einstein concluded that nationalism will take humanity towards downfall so, it must be avoided. In today's context telecommunication and powerful ammunition has made it easier for nations to detest extremism against each other. Therefore, it is the dire need of time to live as a global citizen.
- Mongol's invasion on Baghdad is claimed as the reason behind the downfall of Muslim scientists as their intellectual assets were destroyed. Even Hiroshima was dilapidated with nuclear attack but Japan revived because they allowed people to get knowledge freely. Like Japan, to prosper as a nation, we should adopt an optimistic approach and develop an ideology to survive.

SYMPOSIUMS

INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON SUNFLOWER AND FORAGE CROPS PRODUCTION, CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES

ADVANCED TECHNOLOGIES IN SUNFLOWER AND FORAGE CROPS PRODUCTION ARE REQUIRED

The College of Agriculture at Sargodha University organized an international symposium on 'Sunflower and Forage Crops Production, Challenges and Opportunities' from March 25-27 to provide solutions for local and global challenges faced by sunflower and forage crops.

The problems related to the sustainable supply of forage crops according to the global demands, climate change and rapidly evolving crop husbandry techniques were also discussed. It provided platform to eminent national and international agricultural experts, researchers, scientists and faculty members. The Symposium was sponsored by the Pakistan Science Foundation, Islamabad and Agriculture Linkage Program, Pakistan Agriculture Research Council, Islamabad.

There were three major sessions in the symposium:

- Quality seed production, testing, the scope of hybrid seed production, and supply chains for the private seed companies and farmers.
- New innovative technologies for crop husbandry, crop processing and evaluation.
- Role of breeding and biotechnology in crops improvement.

During these sessions, 19 researchers from USA, China, Turkey, Bulgaria, presented their studies on several aspects of seed supply chains, breeding, biotechnology, and innovative technologies for crop evaluation and processing.

KEY POINTS

- Efforts should be employed to create a push-pull quality culture within the evolving seed sector.
- Farmers should use seed invigorating techniques to improve germinability, storability, overall field emergence and crop stand, and ultimately crop yields.
- Sustainable forage crops yield can be obtained through precision agriculture practices.
- Innovative breeding techniques should be adopted to modify sunflower oil/fatty acid, to introgress resistance against biotic and abiotic factors.
- Waste vegetable oil can be used to make bioplastic which is highly degradable and less pollutant than common plastic.
- Cost effective and user-friendly drone technology should be used for better crop husbandry.

NATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON GREEN CHEMISTRY PRESERVING THE WORLD THROUGH GREEN CHEMISTRY

To explore ways for minimizing the detrimental effects of chemicals on the environment and to achieve sustainability in the chemical production, the Department of Chemistry organized a symposium titled, 'Green Chemistry: Recent Trends and Opportunities' on April 30.

The practice of Green Chemistry not only leads to environmental benefits, but also plays vital role in economic and social growth. The combination of these three benefits is known as the 'triple bottom line' and provides strong encouragement to develop sustainable products and processes.

KEY POINTS

- The principles of Green Chemistry, use of technological protocols pertinent to extraction and process of synthesis for development of healthy products were highlighted.
- Awareness regarding the current environmental issues and potential uses of green/bio-solvents was provided.
- It was emphasized that to create the hazard-free industrial processes and to provide early sustainability in the design process, the source reduction strategies must be incorporated.
- While keeping in view the eco-toxicological and environmental effects of biomass processing, developing eco-friendly chemicals and materials is the need of time.
- It was suggested that to preserve and conserve resources, environmentally benign solvent systems should be utilized.

A scholarly discussion titled 'Media and Social Responsibilities' was conducted on the first day of Sargodha Literary Festival, April 23. The discussion provided a platform for the interactive dialogue and gave insight on the role of media and its responsibilities.

KEY POINTS

- Media is considered as the reflection of society. Therefore, it plays a crucial role in shaping the realities and constructing a whole new digital world.
- The social responsibility of mainstream media is to propagate the voices of the subalterns. This platform highlights societal issues in order to support humanism. However, advocating the oppressed voices raises concerns for journalists. Irrespective of all this, they promote 'freedom of expression' with neutrality.
- The social responsibility of journalists is critical in establishing connection or detachment between the rich and the poor. Though, nowadays, journalists are becoming more prone to having public relations and not focusing on public issues.
- Despite the fact that social media cannot replace mainstream media, it encourages citizen journalism by giving power to the general public. This brings forth the democracy and highlights the societal issues which are sometimes being ignored by the mainstream media.

KEY POINTS

- Youth in Pakistan is dealing with radicalization. Studies show that religiosity, frustration, exclusive mindset, intolerance, divisions of boundaries and youth militancy are some of the indicators of radicalization.

- This era is not about the war of weapons, it is the time period of the war of narratives.
- In the wake of hyper-charged propaganda through social media, young minds are needed to be nourished through reading diverse literature and by getting involved in civilized arguments to develop critical thinking and analytical reasoning.

THE UNIVERSITY HAS PUBLISHED 39 JOINT RESEARCH ARTICLES IN COLLABORATION WITH THE CHINESE UNIVERSITIES AND RESEARCH ORGANIZATIONS.

SUGGESTIONS MADE BY CHINESE DELEGATES

- Sargodha University should include the Chinese language in the University's curriculum as an optional course
- Initiate an undergraduate 4+4 or 6+2 degree program in close collaboration with Chinese universities allowing the students to complete 4-6 semesters in Pakistan and remaining 2-4 semesters in China.
- Focus on training and transfer of Chinese agricultural technology and practices to the region.
- The Chinese delegates emphasized the need for translating Urdu literature in Chinese and Chinese literature in Urdu to bridge the cultural understanding between the people of the two countries.

In response to the suggestions and ideas floated by the Chinese delegates, the Vice Chancellor agreed to explore the possibilities of initiating the joint-degree program and optional language course for students.

The seminar was concluded with an understanding that PICS and the University of Sargodha will benefit from the resources available at various Confucius Institutes in the region while initiating the process of setting up a Confucius Institute at the University of Sargodha.

MORE RESEARCH REQUIRED TO MITIGATE CLIMATE CHANGE

The Department of Earth Sciences, in collaboration with the Ministry of Climate Change, organized a seminar on April 2. In the seminar, Dr Amjad Masood delivered a lecture on 'Climate Change and Water Resources of Pakistan: Emerging Trends in Engineering, Management and Sciences' while Dr Muhammad Azmat shared his thoughts on 'State and Fate of Water Resources to Changing Climate in Pakistan.'

KEY POINTS

- Climate change occurs mainly due to global warming which is primarily caused by the greenhouse effect.
- The worst climate change impacts include melting of glaciers and ice mass, rising sea level, producing flooding and threatening coastal environments, extreme weather phenomena and extinction of species.
- During last century, increase in global temperature was recorded to be 0.6° C, but in the 19th year of the 21st century, it has already been increased more than 0.4° C, which is an alarming condition.
- Climate change causes uncertainty in water availability, decrease in crop yields, loss of biodiversity and increase in health risks.

- Pakistan is the 8th most affected country from climate change, and has become a water stressed country because her reservoirs can store water equivalent to 30 days of consumption, whereas the standard minimum requirement is 120 days.
- More research and appropriate adaptation measures are required to counter the negative impacts of climate change.

SEMINAR ON GEOPHYSICAL TECHNIQUES AND APPLICATIONS: SEEING THE UNSEEN

The Department of Earth Sciences organized a seminar on April 9 titled 'Geophysical Techniques and Applications.'

The speakers from eminent Petroleum industry and Engineering sector highlighted that in the last two decades, new instruments, data-acquisition techniques, non-invasive geophysical methods and processing strategies have made the geophysical data acquisition and interpretation much faster and more reliable.

The case studies related to various stages of The Shallow Geophysical Techniques carries out in UK, Oman and UAE were also discussed.

KEY POINTS

- The geophysical surveys have been employed for the exploration of hydrocarbons but recent advancements have enabled us to use them for engineering and environmental investigations as well.
- The Shallow Geophysical Surveys are conducted for various kinds of investigations that include post-construction structural problems for skyscrapers, evaluation of water reserves, dam abutment seepages, detection of buried pipelines,

artifacts and archeological remains.

- The Shallow Geophysical methods are conducted in remote areas where drilling is not possible and the topography is uneven. For instance, the Laser-link technology was suggested to be used at river banks for seismic reflection data acquisition.

A TRIBUTE TO LATE NUCLEAR SCIENTIST, DR MASUD AHMAD, HILAL-I-IMTIAZ

Dr Muhammad Masud Ahmad (1943-2018) the esteemed alumnus of Government College Sargodha/University of Sargodha was an illustrious nuclear scientist. He served as Member Science in Pakistan Atomic Energy Commission (PAEC) and Member, Chairman Advisory Council. Dr Ahmad had developed the design of nuclear bomb which was tested in May 1998. In recognition of his significant contributions in the country's nuclear program, he was conferred upon Hilal-i-Imtiaz and Pride of Performance by the Government of Pakistan in 1998.

Dr Ahmad attained his degree of Bachelor of Science from Government College Sargodha in 1963. The Newsletter Team interviewed Dr Ahmad's daughter, Ms Noshin Masud, to know more about the celebrated theoretical physicist and proud alumnus of the University.

Being a nuclear scientist, what were Dr Ahmad's views regarding the national development and defense?

He was a staunch supporter of positive use of nuclear science in agriculture, health and research sector. In spite of developing the design of nuclear bomb for country's defense, he suggested peaceful use of nuclear technology and never wanted to see countries living in a state of fear and worry.

What motivated Dr Ahmad to pursue career in nuclear science?

He was passionate towards science and used to put his soul in everything. Apart from this, he had a knack of getting into the minutest details which enabled him to achieve perfection in his work. He was naturally gifted a brain of scientist, and this is the reason that choosing nuclear sciences turned out to be the best decision of his life.

How other people around you remember your father?

They all say one thing 'Putting others first.' He was extremely considerate and always used to put others comfort before anything. Other than his professional side, he had a very sharp sense of humor and had the ability to induce life in any gathering with his humorous remarks and one-liners.

If Dr Ahmad was ever asked to give a message to the students of Sargodha University, what he would have suggested?

He was deeply inspired by the Nobel Laureate Dr. Abdus Salam, since he had the opportunity to work with him, so he used to impart lessons he learnt from him. He used to advise: "Never worry about the outcome and always give your best shot. Fretting about results will only affect your journey. Put in your best and leave the rest to destiny."

Moreover, he never restricted his daughters from excelling in life and never discouraged them in going after what they wanted to achieve.

GOLD MEDAL FOR RESEARCH CONTRIBUTIONS IN ENTOMOLOGICAL SCIENCES

Dr Muhammad Zeeshan Majeed, Lecturer at the Department of Entomology, College of Agriculture, Sargodha University has been awarded Prof Dr Imtiaz Ahmad Gold Medal 2019 by the Zoological Society of Pakistan on his outstanding research contributions in Entomological Sciences.

The medal was conferred on him by Dr Abdul Rauf Shakoori, the President of Zoological Society of Pakistan during the inaugural ceremony of the 39th International Pakistan Congress of Zoology, held at the Islamia College University, Peshawar in March 2019.

The award was bestowed on Dr Majeed in recognition of his contribution to entomological research in the form of research papers published in the reputed national and international scientific journals and various research projects.

"The University of Sargodha groomed me professionally and enabled me to work hard with my full potential to qualify for this award of honor," says Dr Majeed.

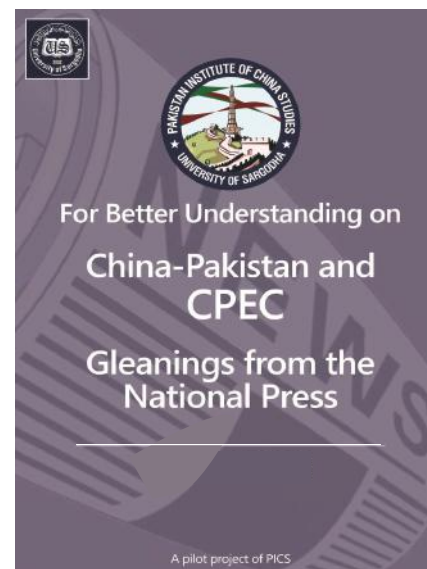
PICS COMPILES DATA TO FACILITATE RESEARCH ON CHINA

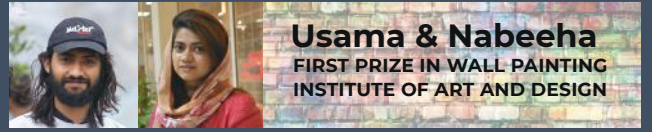
STUDENTS WIN 6 POSITIONS IN 1ST YOUTH CARNIVAL 2019

The talented squad of University of Sargodha won six positions in 12th Youth Carnival 2019 held at the Institute of Space Technology, Islamabad on March 28-30.

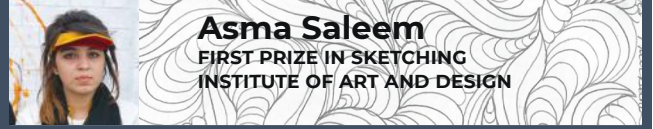

This year, from all over the Pakistan, students from 50 different universities participated in the event to compete with each other and to showcase their talent and skills.

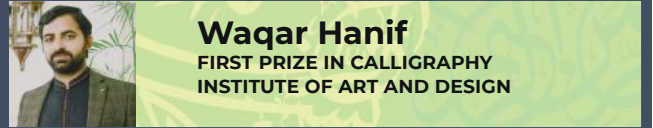

مطالعہ استشراق کی اسلامی روایت کے رجحانات و اثرات کے جائزے کے لیے شعبہ علوم اسلامیہ، یونیورسٹی آف سرگودھا کی جانب سے ”مطالعہ استشراق کی مسلم روایت: رجحانات و اثرات“ کے عنوان کے تحت مورخہ 29 اور 30 اپریل کو دو روزہ بین الاقوامی کانفرنس منعقد ہوئی۔
