





WORLD UNIVERSITY RANKINGS

2023

The University of Sargodha (UOS) has been ranked at 801+ in the Impact Rankings 2023 issued by Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings 2023 on June 01, 2023. The 2023 Impact Rankings is the fifth edition, and the overall ranking includes 1,591 universities from 112 countries/regions.

The Times Higher Education Impact Rankings are the only global performance tables that assess universities against the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), using carefully calibrated indicators to provide comprehensive and balanced comparisons across four broad areas: research, stewardship, outreach, and teaching.

The University of Sargodha has ranked in the world at 201+ Zero Hunger, 201+ in quality education, 401+ in Gender Equality, 601+ in Partnerships for the Goals and 801+ in Good Health and Well-Being. The University has been ranked at 10 out the 17 universities of the Pakistan.

UOS SECURES TOP POSITION IN THE 2023 ASIA RANKINGS FOR TEACHING EXCELLENCE

According to the Times Higher Education (THE) Asia University Rankings 2023, the University of Sargodha (UOS) has achieved the distinction of being ranked as the best university in Punjab for teaching and the second best university in Pakistan.

The University climbed an impressive 50 places in the latest edition of THE Asia University Rankings for 2023, surpassing its previous position of 350+ and securing a place at 301+.

On June 22, THE released a list of the best universities in Asia for 2023. The University of Sargodha reaffirmed its commitment to

academic excellence and exceptional teaching practices. The university has emerged as the leading institution for teaching in Punjab and secured the second spot in Pakistan. Overall, the university stands at an impressive 22nd position among the 200+universities in Pakistan.

NEED TO PROMOTE INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT, SAYS PROF. DR. QAISAR ABBAS

In an effort to promote international collaboration and sustainable development, the Vice Chancellor University of Sargodha, Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas, attended the 2023 Forum of University Alliance of the Belt and Road (UAB&R) held in Xining, Qinghai Province, China.

The UAB&R Forum, held from April 26 to 28, 2023, focusing on two major themes: global climate change and environmental protection, and high-standard collaborations for the sustainable development of universities. Delegates from various universities across the world were in attended the Forum share their insights and experiences on these themes.

Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas presented on the teaching, research. and collaborative activities of the university. He highlighted the University's commitment to address global challenges through interdisciplinary research and education, and emphasized the importance of international collaborations to achieve sustainable development. He also discussed the University's efforts to establish linkages with universities in the Belt and Road region and how these partnerships have facilitated knowledge exchange and ioint initiatives.

Other delegates also presented on their respective university's activities, and stressed the need for continued collaboration and partnerships to address global challenges. The forum provided a platform for networking and exchange of ideas, and showcased the potential for international cooperation in promoting sustainable development.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE EXPLORES NEW CROPPING TRENDS

The Vice Chancellor University of Sargodha, Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas, also attended the 2023 International Conference on "Scientific Use of Agricultural Films" and the 2023 Symposia of "Ecological Society of Belt & Road University Alliance" in Lanzhou, China. The conference was aimed to explore the latest trends and developments in the use of agricultural films to increase crop yield and protect crops from pests and weather fluctuations.

The delegates also visited the Lanzhou Jintudi Plastic Products Co., Ltd. and its recycling unit of used plastic, and appreciated the efforts of the company in promoting sustainable practices and minimizing the impact of plastic waste on the environment. Overall, the visits, participation in the Forum, Conferences, and Symposia is expected to promote collaborations between the University of Sargodha and the institutions in China and other Belt & Road countries.

Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas discussed the goals of international partnerships which is subjected to enhance the quality education, promote cultural understanding and exchange, and to expand the

scope of research and innovation. He also highlighted the advantages of internationalization such as increased exposure to diverse perspectives, improved academics and research outcomes, and expanded career opportunities for students and faculty.

Dr. Abbas emphasized on the internationalization of research and education aiming to connect and build academic ties and linkages through strategic partnership with stakeholders, harnessing leadership, generating useful knowledge, fostering enduring values, and projecting sustainable technologies and practices across the world. He stressed on introducing the triple helix model of linkages in higher education including academia, industry and government.

The Covid-19 pandemic had both disruptive and innovative effects on global academic mobility programs.

He added that the move to virtual modalities has opened new room for knowledge dissemination and innovative ways to create international environments and support cross-cultural exchange.

He further added that in the Post-Covid scenario, the use of digital transformation and online curriculum delivery involving new approaches such as distance learning and hybrid learning can create a sustainable and resilient work ecosystem in higher education.

Dr. Abbas concluded that the development of common research agendas, sharing objectives and joint research projects, on a cross-border and transnational basis, can contribute to solving the complex societal challenges of the future in line with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



- There is a need for an incentive-driven approach to encourage consumers to change their plastic consumption habits.
- Government should have to establish a comprehensive framework and timeline for phasing out single-use plastics.


The DPI is an attached department under the Higher Education Department (HED) Punjab, that performs a coordinating role between the secretariat and field formations in Punjab.


